Śāstra se Samvād tak: 'Decolonizing Indian Anthropology - A Civilizational Approach.'

Dr. Sachidanand Joshi, Mr. Raghavendra Singh, and Mr. K. Anil Kumar

A profound discussion with authors Mr. Raghavendra Singh and Mr. K. Anil Kumar was conducted to deconstruct colonial distortions in the study of India's forest and hill communities. The authors advocated for a decolonized anthropological perspective, challenging Western "primitive" labels to highlight the deep, unified civilizational connections between tribal populations and the broader Indian narrative. By reimagining these historical links, the session emphasized the inherent dignity of these communities and their essential role in fostering a cohesive sense of national pride and unity.

Mantraṇā: 'Bharat ki Parampara'

Dr. Om Jee Upadhyay

This high-level roundtable focused on Parampara (tradition) as a living guide for the present rather than a static past. Participants analyzed how the Sanskrit concept of Mantraṇā (deep deliberative counsel) applies to modern decision-making and strategic autonomy. The session aimed to produce actionable insights reflecting India's self-identity (Swa) and its role as a Vishwa Guru.

The discussion delved into the impact of historical legacies on modern diplomacy. Amb Yashvardhan Sinha examined how ancestral statecraft and past territorial narratives continue to influence India's contemporary strategic responses to its neighbors. The session further emphasized that integrating these classical principles into modern foreign policy not only strengthens regional stability but also offers a uniquely Indian framework for navigating complex geopolitical transitions.
